BRAWERMAN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TRAVEL POLICY 2020-2021 (UPDATED ASOF 4/15/21)

In furtherance of Brawerman's Health and Safety Expectations at Home as set forth in Brawerman's "Return to Campus Policy for Students" and our shared efforts to limit the spread of COVID-19 and to keep our community safe, Brawerman has adopted this policy (the "Policy") in conformity with the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (the "CDC"), the State of California Department of Public Health and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health. **Please note that this Policy applies to unvaccinated individuals, which include all elementary school students. Adult vaccination status does** *not* **transfer to the student.**

- <u>Avoid Non-Essential Travel</u>: As the CDC has determined that travel increases the chance of getting and spreading COVID-19, families, faculty and staff are encouraged to avoid non-essential travel.
- <u>Adhere to Precautions During and Following Travel</u>: When families, faculty and staff must travel, they should ensure that they conform to the following precautions during and after travel:
 - limit in-person interactions;
 - avoid large or mass gatherings where proper physical distancing measures and masking are not practiced;
 - practice physical distancing;
 - wear face coverings when in public or when around unvaccinated people who are not part of your household;
 - wash hands frequently;
 - void contact with anyone who is sick;
 - monitor for symptoms of COVID-19;
 - isolate and get tested if symptoms develop; and
 - follow any other guidelines or restrictions included in any Executive Orders issued by the Governor, or other guidance issued by the CDC or the California and/or Los Angeles County Departments of Public Health, as well as any guidelines or regulations issued by the relevant government officials and agencies of the destination locale. Families, faculty and staff should anticipate that such guidelines or regulations may change, even during a period of travel, and be prepared to comply with any such changing guidance or regulations.
- <u>Seven Day Quarantine Option</u>: When returning from any location outside of California (domestic or international), persons who are not fully vaccinated can quarantine for seven full days after return, provided they have a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken three to five days after return.
- <u>*Ten Day Quarantine Option:*</u> When returning from any location outside of California (domestic or international), persons who are not fully vaccinated must quarantine for ten full days after

return if they do not get tested after arrival (as described above in *Seven Day Quarantine Option*).

- <u>Self-Monitor</u>: All individuals (vaccinated or not) should self-monitor for symptoms consistent with COVID-19 for 14 days after arrival, avoid being around people who are at increased risk for severe illness and must isolate and should get tested if symptoms develop.
- <u>Adherence to Applicable Order</u>: To the extent that the CDC, State of California, Los Angeles County or any other governmental or regulatory authority promulgates a travel quarantine or similar order applicable to residents of the City of Los Angeles, families, faculty and staff will be expected to adhere to any such order.

Students, faculty and staff may be required to get tested prior to any return to campus as determined in the sole discretion of the Head of School of Brawerman (in consultation with Wilshire Boulevard Temple's Chief COVID Officer). Results of any such required PCR test shall be emailed to Brawerman at <u>BrawermanTravelPolicy@brawerman.org</u> in advance of any return to campus.

This Policy may be revised or updated from time-to-time as determined in the sole discretion of Brawerman (in consultation with the Temple's Chief COVID Officer) and will be in effect until otherwise rescinded by Brawerman. Parents, faculty and staff are expected to read, understand and adhere to this Policy. All decisions regarding the applicability of this Policy shall be made in the sole discretion of the Head of School of Brawerman (in consultation with Wilshire Boulevard Temple's Chief COVID Officer) and shall be final and binding.
